Resolution 16-08-08-08 regarding Little Free Libraries

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WHEREAS, the maintenance and security of the Village Right of Way adjacent to our roadway is essential for the safety and aesthetics of neighboring properties and the integrity of underground utilities; and

WHEREAS, occasions do arise when the public interest is served by permitting appropriate intrusions into the Right of Way; and

WHEREAS, the Permitting process under the Village Sign Code and the requirement of Board of Trustee approval offer sufficient oversight to license a specific use within the Village Right of Way; and

WHEREAS, a request has been made to permit the maintenance of five “Little Free Libraries” cubbies located at Peterkin Park, Nautical Park, Park Avenue Elementary School, the Vest Pocket Park, and Northwest School, Amityville Beach, which will permit children and adults to keep, borrow, or deposit appropriate and discreet books, limited to classical and popular literature; and

WHEREAS, the Village maintains the unequivocal right to both revoke such Permit at any time and remove the contents of such cubby, whether to the health, safety, morals, and public welfare shall require;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a limited license is hereby approved for the maintenance of five Little Free Library cubbies within the Right of Way at the locations listed above, subject to the issuance of a sign permit by the Building Department, and the Village’s absolute privilege to revoke such license and dispose of the contents of such cubbies when the public health and welfare requires. The licensee shall remove the cubby and restore the Right of Way within seven (7) days of the mailing of written notice thereof.

Deputy Mayor Bernius states that these libraries are located at the Nautical Park, Vest Pocket Park, and Peterkin Park, these are such a big hit that they are looking to put another one for adults up at Peterkin Park;

There being no further "Good News", Deputy Mayor Bernius opened the floor to the public:


