**RESOLUTION 23-05-08-01**

WHEREAS, at the Board of Trustee Meeting held on April 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023, the Board of Trustees approved the proposed 2023-2024 budget in the total amount of \$20,641,663, with a real property tax levy of \$14,190,633, and a tax rate of \$38.58/100;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees desires to reallocate appropriate additional revenue to interest and earnings to lower the real property taxes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees approve to amend the following estimated revenues categories of the 2023-2024 adopted budget: Increase Interest & Earnings from \$107,009 to \$137,345; decrease Real Property Taxes from \$14,190,633 to \$14,168,564, which lowers the tax rate to \$38.52/100; and decrease Payments In Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) from \$578,976 to \$570,709 as a result of the lower tax rate.

**Introductory Local Law No. 5 of the year 2023**

A local law to establish Municipal Parking Field No 18

**Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Amityville as follows:**

Section 1. The Board of Trustees finds that it is necessary to establish a new Municipal Parking Field (No 18) in a portion of the area leased from the Long Island Railroad Company ( a division of the Metropolitan Transportation Authority) under the railroad trestle to provide more commuter parking between County Line Road and Burch Avenue.

Section 2. § 172-63 of the Code of the Village of Amityville is hereby amended to add Municipal Parking Field No 18 as follows:

"Parking Field	Location	Parking Time Limits	Business Employee Parking
No 18	Underneath railroad between County Line Rd and Burch Avenue	48 hour limit by permit	No"

Section 3. This local law shall take effect immediately.
