Greetings,

We are keeping an eye on Tropical Storm Isaias and right now it is projected to sweep through our area tomorrow afternoon into early Wednesday morning, bringing high winds and high tides. High tide takes place at 11:27 a.m. and 11:41 p.m. on Tuesday, with a full moon also expected.

Our Police and Fire Departments are on standby to rescue residents who might be stranded due to flooding, but we encourage everyone to check the weather and news reports and be ready to evacuate, if necessary. Superstorm Sandy taught us all to have an evacuation plan ready and to not wait until the last minute to be rescued from flood waters. Now is the time to be proactive.

Residents in flood prone areas are encouraged to move their cars temporarily to our municipal parking lots due to the potential weather emergency. No sticker is required from Tuesday 8/4/20 until Friday, 8/7/20. Lots include the LIRR north and south lots, O'Connor Parking Field (Oak St. adjacent to library), the south parking lot (on Broadway, across from First Methodist Church) and Lot #5 (the old movie theater lot, between Union Ave. and Oak St. at Broadway). Please leave the Bennett Place lot and southwest side of the LIRR lot open for first responders.

Be prepared for power outages and downed tree limbs. Travel may be dangerous, and we ask everyone to stay off the roads unless your trip is essential.

As always, our first responders are here to help you and your family, 24/7.
