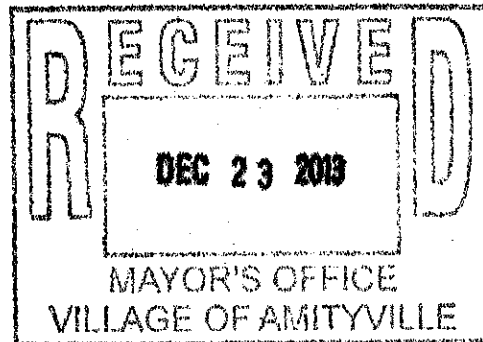

Local Law No. 5 of the year 2013

A local law to enact term limits for certain elected officials of the Village of Amityville.

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the

County City Town Village

of Amityville as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Trustees finds that it is the best interests of the residents of the Village to limit the number of consecutive years that a person can serve as Mayor or as a Trustee in the Village. The Board further finds that it has the authority to enact such term limits pursuant to Article IX, Section 2c (1) of the New York State Constitution and Section 10 (1) (ii) (a) of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 2. Chapter 28 of the Code of the Village of Amityville is hereby amended to add a new section 28-4 as follows:

“§ 28-4 Term Limits.

A. No person who is elected to the Office of Mayor in the Village of Amityville after the effective date of this local law shall serve for more than two (2) consecutive four (4) year terms.

B. No person who is elected as a Trustee of the Village of Amityville after the effective date of this local law shall serve as a Trustee for more than two (2) consecutive four (4) year terms.”

Section 3. This local law shall be effective immediately.
