I would like to remind our Village property owners that tomorrow, July 1st, is the last day to pay first half property taxes without penalty. Village Hall is open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. to pay in person, and if mailed, payments must be postmarked by July 1st. You can also pay online at Amityville.com (transaction fees may apply.) Thank you!

Now, on to more pleasant thoughts! I hope you have plans for a wonderful July 4th weekend that is coming up quickly. The Village is thrilled to be able to host the annual July 4th parade, which steps off at 11 a.m. (line up at 10 a.m.) at Ocean Avenue and Bourdette Pl.

This year's theme will honor the extraordinary contributions of our first responders and essential workers, who helped keep us safe, fed, healthy and ease the stress and heartache that the pandemic brought with it. The Parade Route is: Ocean Ave. and Bourdette Pl., North to Ocean Ave., West to S. Ireland Pl., North on Bennett Pl. to Broadway, West on Ireland Pl., North on Ketcham Ave. to W. Oak Street, ending at the firehouse for a barbecue. Please join us if you are able.

We have a few more exciting events to share for our Village residents and their guests.

The Beach is open and youth swimming has begun. Sailing lessons for those already registered starts on Monday.

Remember to get your beach pass, either at the Beach entrance gate for Village residents (proof of residency required) or at Village Hall.

Wednesday Night Suppers by the Bay are back **and start tonight at 6 p.m.** Join in the fun – with live music from Acoustic Blue and a great new menu from our new food concessionaire, Lu's Deli (yes – there will be lobster rolls....and crab cakes!)

Mark your calendars for the return of the Beach Blast and Fireworks Show on Saturday, August 28th. If you've been to them before, you'll know what an amazing and exciting event that is! Live band, beach games, bouncy house and kids activities.

Along with the Amityville Chamber of Commerce, we're introducing "**Fridays on the Village Greene**" -- a street party, Amityville style that kicks off on July 9th, from 6 pm. to 10:30 p.m. with live music, outdoor tables, craft beer and tables for seating where you can enjoy local take out meals. Additional dates are July 23, August 6th and 20th. Invite your friends and enjoy some socializing as you support local restaurants and delis.

We will also be hosting **live music** on select Wednesday evenings at the Village Beach and welcome the return of *Radio Flashback*, a local 70s cover band featuring Amityville's own Steve Pisani, on the evening of July 24th.

I would also like to remind residents that now that the weather is warmer (EXTREMELY warm today) you must file for a Pool Permit with the Village if you are putting in or already have a pool of any type that is more than 2 foot deep. Failure to do so could result in double the application fees and other potential fines. Also note, fence enclosures are required for all pools – either around the pool or the property. - Dredging of the Bayview Canal and the mouth of Ketcham's Creek have been completed and boaters are already taking advantage of the deeper water and safer channels. We are grateful to the Army Corps of Engineers and Suffolk County for slotting us into the schedule this year, as the demand far outweighs the available dredging resources.
- Redevelopment of the "old movie theater" property at 221 Broadway into apartments with a restaurant below is moving along at a good pace with exterior work progressing.
- The redevelopment of the old Brunswick Hospital property by Avalon Bay is also moving along and the foundation is being poured.
- The Bay Village Civic Association's Farmer's Market continues to welcome shoppers on Saturday mornings, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and it has been good to see so many repeat customers, for fresh produce, specialty foods, coffees, pickles, sweets and gift and craft items. If you haven't checked it out this weekend is a great time to do so!
